



## Biscovey Academy Physical Education and Sport Premium Planned Spend 2021-22



Total amount of funding expected: £19,200

### Swimming

The curriculum states that all children should be able to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25m. They should be able to use a range of strokes and have knowledge of safe, self-rescue in different water based situations.

\*Due to COVID-19, this cohort of children missed their end of school assessment, so this figure is based upon the most recent assessment. It is likely that this figure would increase by 2 or 3 children.

\*\*Due to COVID-19, this cohort of children missed their year 5 and year 6 swimming provision. We offered intensive swimming top-up sessions in June 2021 to try to give them the opportunity to swim, but had they engaged with regular school swimming previously I am confident this number would be higher.
